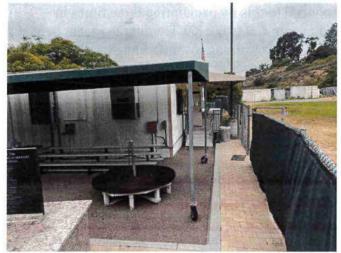

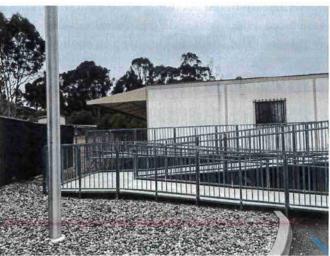
On June 12, 2024, EEO 2024-013 was assigned to me.

None of the cameras covered the landing area where Officer Mullins would have been. None of the cameras covered the portion of the training field where Officer would have been. The "West Trailer" camera comes the closest to showing the area (See image below). The camera shows the east side of the building. On the far-right edge of the camera's view, a door can be seen above a small staircase. This is where officers would exit the office and walk onto the landing area. The landing area is just out of the camera's view. The training field is also outside of the camera's view.

The "Main Gate" camera comes the closest to showing the area from the west side of the building (See image below). It appears to be focused on the gate, so the staircase leading down to the parking lot from the west side of the building is only covered in the far-left edge of the camera's view. The landing and the northwest corner of the building are out of the camera's view. The training field is also outside of the camera's view.



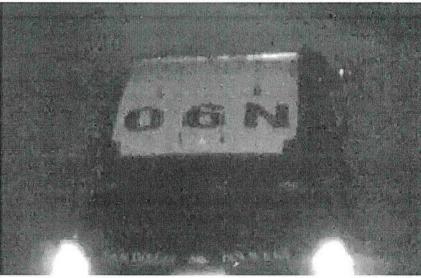
I reviewed the footage between 2100 hours and 2200 hours for both cameras. I downloaded the recordings, and I added them to the case file. The lighting is poor, and the images are not clear enough to definitively identify the officers who are shown. There is also no audio component to the video, so none of the verbal interaction was captured.

The "Main Gate" camera shows two officers walking down the stairs toward the parking lot at the 21:35:44 mark (See image below on the left). One of the males appears to have a shaved head or very short hair. They appear to be communicating and using their arms to express themselves as they walk toward the parking lot. They disappear from the camera's view at the 21:35:58 mark. At the 21:38:32 mark, a police vehicle comes into the camera's view as it is backing out of a parking spot. The vehicle drives out of the main gate (See image below on the right). The top of the vehicle has the identifier, "06N" on it. Officer Mullins' call sign was "2906N." This was Officer Mullins' assigned vehicle.

Based on the footage described above, it appears likely that the interaction between Officer Mullins and Officer curred at about 2135 hours, or just prior to that time. Working backward from that point, I reviewed the footage from the "West Trailer" camera. At the 21:32:50 mark, an officer can be seen walking out of the building to the landing area. He appears to match Officer Mullins' physical characteristics (See image below).



This officer moves out of the camera's view immediately after exiting the building. At the 21:34:03, another officer exits the building. He appears to be taller and thinner than the last officer. He also appears to be wearing a hat (See image below).

This officer also moves out of the camera's view immediately after exiting the building. He appears to be looking at something to the west as he walks back into the building at the 21:34:23 mark (See image below).



At the 21:34:56 mark, this officer walks back out of the building (See image below on the left). He is followed immediately by a second officer (See image below on the right). They both turn left and head to the west on the landing. They disappear from view almost immediately. One of their left arms can be seen briefly, but the camera does not capture any distinct actions or events.

At the 21:35:11 mark, another officer walks out of the building (See below). He also appears to turn left and pause briefly before moving to the west on the landing. He exits the camera's view almost immediately.



At the 21:35:21 mark, an officer can be seen coming into the camera's view from further west on the landing area. He appears to be moving quickly as he goes down the stairs (See image below). He disappears from the camera's view again as he gets to the bottom of the stairs. Based on the timing and statements, this is likely Sergeant going out to contact Officer on the training field.



Though the footage does not capture the interaction between Officer Mullins and Officer suggests the incident occurred between 2132 hours and 2135 hours on June 6, 2024.

Officer told me Thursday, June 12, 2024, was a "barrel day." He told me he typically attempts to stay away from the office on "barrel days," specifically to avoid Officer Mullins. Officer told me he just got done helping with a "K9 Academy," so he was just getting back to his squad. He decided to go into the office that day. Officer told me there was "typical banter" between officers inside the office. He told me Officer Mullins was giving other officers a hard time about "missing out on a bite." Officer told me they have a "very informal" lineup at the K9 office. He told me they break the dogs and then they generally "hang out" for about an hour, between 2000 and 2100 hours, before they go out in the field. Sometimes they discuss specific events or review BWC footage.						
Officer said he decided to take the officers outside at approximately 2100 hours to begin some training. He put on a bite suit and initially started to work with Officer and his dog. After Officer completed his training, Officer brought his dog out to work with Officer on the field. Officer told me they were doing some "targeting work," so he was in the process of taking a bite in the leg from Officer dog. Officer Mullins walked out of the office and onto the "landing." He looked at Officer and Officer and Officer and Said, "Looks like great training." Officer said he "picked up a sarcastic tone to it." Officer responded by saying, "Thank you for noticing. If you wanna hang around, you could probably learn a thing or two." Officer Mullins responded by saying, "What? What'd you say?" Officer and Said, "I don't wanna learn shit from you." Officer Mullins looked at Officer and Said, "I don't wanna learn shit from you." Officer Mullins ince the bite was just handed to you." Officer Mullins questioned the statement by saying, "What do you mean, handed to me? You weren't even there." Officer said, "Well, yes, I was. It was my first watch squad that was 97 on the call for a solid two hours. You showed up – five minutes – gave one warning, sent your dog in, and got the bite." Officer resumed his description of the interaction he had with Officer Mullins on June 6, 2024. He told me Officer Mullins was getting more agitated at that point. Officer Mullins asked, "Well, who on patrol is saying that? Who on patrol is saying that?" Officer told him, "Everyone, Mike. Everyone." I asked Officer what the patrol officers were specifically saying about Officer Mullins. Officer told me, "That he's afraid to use his dog." He told me patrol officers are asking why Officer Mullins is allowing officers to go into unknown areas without sending his dog in first. Officer said Officer Mullins looked at him and said, "Keep sucking dick. Just keep sucking dick." Officer said Officer Mullins repeated that statement three or four times. Officer told me it has been well known, "throughout the years," that Officer Mullins views him and some of the other trainers as being Sergeant told me there are a total of six "trainers" in the K9 unit. Officer said he is one of three trainers that Officer Mullins clearly does not like.							
Detective Sergeant Chambers asked Officer what he thought about the comment Officer Mullins made about "sucking dick." Officer said he was "extremely taken aback by it" in the heat of the moment. He described it as a transition from "back and forth banter" to "diving off the deep end." Officer told me he has had people make "inappropriate jokes" about him before. He said Officer Mullins didn't make the comment in a joking manner. He said, "You could tell there was some anger behind the statement." Officer said it was "offsetting" because Sergeant is a supervisor in charge of the training. He thought the statement was "weird at first." He thought, "What are you implying by that?"							
Officer said he did not initially put too much thought into the comment. He said he started thinking about it later on, after he got home. He said it offended him. Officer said Officer

Officer said Officer was in the parking lot at the time of this interaction. Officer told me Officer was able to hear Officer Mullins screaming at him. He said Officer came running over to find out what was going on.							
Officer said Officer Mullins was "actively trying to push through" the other officers to get down to him. Officer said he specifically remembered seeing Officer put his arm out. He said he saw Officer Mullins smack Officer arm down as he tried to get through him. Officer told me he was on the field with Officer while Officer Mullins was on the landing with three officers holding him back. Officer told me he was in a full bite suit at the time of this interaction. He said the suit limits his arm mobility and prevents him from being able to run at full speed.

Officer went back to his description of the incident from June 6, 2024. He said people heard the interaction and came outside. He heard people screaming, "Stop! Stop! Knock it off!" Officer told me officers escorted Officer Mullins to the end of the landing. Officer came outside and went towards the parking lot area with Officer Mullins.							
Officer said he felt like he could have been physically harmed by Officer Mullins if the other officers hadn't held him back. Officer said Officer Mullins' behavior caused him to believe he wanted a physical confrontation. He said Officer Mullins' demeanor got so elevated that he "snapped" and wanted to push past the officers to get down to him. Based on his words and behavior, Officer believed Officer Mullins wanted to get down to the field to assault him. Officer described Officer Mullins as being a "larger person." He told me Officer Mullins was in full police uniform. Officer said it was also concerning to him that Officer Mullins had lost complete control of his emotions, but he was still armed with his gun. He said, "Not that I think he would have shot me." Officer questioned Officer Mullins' ability to control his emotions as a K9 handler working in a "high use of force unit." Officer said Officer Mullins likely had a baton, OC, knife, and potentially a Taser with him.							
I asked Officer "At any point during the incident, did you feel any sense of fear that he was going to physically attack you or use a weapon against you?" He said, "Well, physically attack, yes. I did

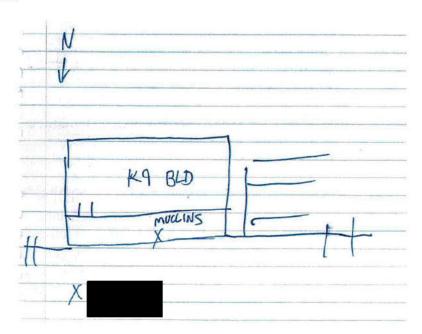

I asked Officer about the anonymous letter. I told him it seemed to be a "setting off point" in this interaction. I asked him if that was something that had been discussed with Officer Mullins previously, or if it was something that was talked about. Officer told me he has tried to avoid Officer Mullins for the past year. He said, "I don't talk to him. I don't acknowledge him. Acknowledge him in the sense of I don't go out of my way to like — I just keep to myself. I've never discussed to him about any letter or anything like that, but it's kinda one of those things that's just commonly known though kennel talk, that this letter was out there. So, I just try to keep my distance as much as possible. And a lot of times, like I said, I'll just avoid the office." Officer told me there has been discussion about this anonymous letter. He told me it is his opinion that Officer Mullin's probably wrote it. Officer said he had not interacted with Officer Mullins since January 6, 2024.

Officer explained the layout of the building, field, and landing he was describing. I asked him to sketch it out for me. The landing area is on the north side of the building and there is a field to the north of it. The gate to the field is near the northeast corner of the building. There is a fence surrounding the field. It separates the field from the landing area, and it is approximately 6 feet tall. The sketch Officer did during the interview is shown below. He marked where he and Officer Mullins were standing at the time of the interaction.

I try to handle stuff on a POIIto-POII level, or officer to officer level, without bringing something up, but it's just the continuous cycle. I mean, if you guys speak to enough handlers at K9, the overwhelming majority will say there's some kind of avoidance, or at least they check the map to kinda know what they're getting into before they walk into the office. And everyone, I think everyone, it's not just me, has some level of concern about Officer Mullins." Officer told me he did not believe it would be a viable option for him to handle this situation in a "person to person" environment with Officer Mullins. He told me, "Absolutely not. I wouldn't even expose myself to trying to contact him. And after what I saw there, I wouldn't even risk my career. Like, there's just no way." Officer indicated it was easier to avoid the issue with Officer Mullins than to have a larger issue come out of it. Officer said, "I think that's the running gameplan for a lot of the guys. Officer has been a police officer for approximately 24 years. He currently works as a Canine officer. He works 3 rd Watch and he has Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays off. He has been working as a Canine handler for the past ten years.
Officer told me he knows Officer who is another Canine handler. Officer is on his squad and acts as the squad's designated trainer. He has known Officer since he began working at Canine, but he wasn't sure exactly when Officer started working there.
Officer told me he knows Officer Mike Mullins, who also works as a Canine handler. He has known Officer Mullins for about 12-13 years. He knew Officer Mullins when they both worked as patrol officers at Western Division.
Officer told me he was working on Thursday, June 6, 2024. He told me he was at the Canine training facility at 4240 Federal Blvd between about 2000 hours and 2100 hours. He told me he was doing "some training" at that time. Officer told me they usually plan their training for times when there is an overlap, and another squad can cover the radio. He told me Thursday is their "barrel day." Officer told me he witnessed an altercation between Officer and Officer Mullins outside of the building. He believed it occurred between 2100 hours and 2130 hours.
Officer told me he was out on the training field with Officer He told me there were a few officers on the landing area, on the other side of a six-foot fence. Officer was wearing the "bite suit" and Officer had his Police Service Dog (PSD) out with him for the training.
Officer said his PSD was biting Officer in the leg, as they had planned for it to do. Officer Mullins walked out of the office and said something like, "I see some good (or outstanding) training going on." Officer told me it was a "sarcastic" remark. He told me he has known Officer Mullins for several years. He told me, "He's always been a, I don't know how else to say it other than like a ball buster."

I read Sergeant the Witness Officer Sworn Personnel Admonishment. Officer verbally acknowledged the admonishment by stating, "Understood." He also told me he had no questions about it.
Sergeant has been a police officer for approximately 17 years. He currently works as a sergeant in the Canine Unit. He works 3 rd Watch and he has Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays off. He worked as an officer in the Canine unit for two years. He later returned to the Canine Unit as a sergeant, and he has been working in that capacity for the past three years.
Sergeant told me he knows Officer who is a Canine handler. Sergeant is Officer direct supervisor. Sergeant has known Officer for about three years. Officer has been working on his squad for less than a year.
Sergeant told me he knows Officer Mike Mullins, who also works as a Canine handler. He has known Officer Mullins for about three years, but Officer Mullins has never worked directly for him.
Sergeant told me he was working on Thursday, June 6, 2024. He told me he was at the Canine training facility at 4240 Federal Blvd between about 2000 hours and 2100 hours. He told me he was inside the office at that time. He told me their lineup had just concluded. Officer had asked Officer to do some training with him out on the field. Sergeant stayed inside the office along with Officer who was working as an acting sergeant at that time.
Sergeant told me their lineups in the Canine Unit are less formal than lineups at patrol commands. He estimated they got done with their lineup at about 2030 hours. He told me the Padre game had been on the television in the background. He suggested lineup may have ended because the baseball game ended.
I asked Sergeant if he witnessed an altercation between Officer and Officer Mullins outside of the building. He told me, "It was brought to my attention later on, after I heard a commotion. So, I came into that interaction, I guess, later on. I did not see what began. I don't know what occurred. I only know what transpired after everything had already run its course."
I asked Sergeant what he heard that caused him to describe it as a "commotion." He told me, "Loud yelling. Almost like screaming." He told me it is not uncommon to hear screaming at a Canine facility during training. Sergeant told me, "Usually there is screaming when a dog is biting

before he walked outside. Officer had assumed Sergeant would deal with anything related to a dog bite because it was his squad who was doing training at that time.

He was yelling up at Officer Mullins. Officer was out on the field, training with Officer at that time. Officer told me he was able to walk straight over to Officer Mullins and get in front of his face. He told me Officer and Officer were also out there. He told me it was a congested walkway because of the bleachers on the landing. He told me he walked toward Officer Mullins, and they went toward the parking lot together.
I asked Officer if he heard either officer say anything inappropriate or offensive, in either an EEO sense or a threatening sense. He told me, "No. To me, it just sounded like two guys disliked each other and were just yelling at each other." He told me he did not hear Officer Mullins make the comment, "Keep sucking dick." I asked Officer if he ever felt like there was a need for a physical intervention to prevent a physical altercation. On August 16, 2024, at 1300 hours, I interviewed Officer Mullins in Interview Room 1 in the Internal Affairs office. Officer Mullins told me David is his legal first name, but he goes by Mike. was present as Officer Mullins' representative. Internal Affairs Detective Sergeant Chambers #7021 was also present during this interview.						
The following is a paraphrased statement. Statements in quotations are clean transcriptions from the audio recording. (For exact and complete details of the interview, refer to the audio recording. The recording is 30 minutes and 5 seconds in length.)						
I read Officer Mullins the Subject Officer Sworn Personnel Admonishment (With Lybarger/Garrity Warning). Officer Mullins indicated he fully understood the instructions by signing his name at the bottom of the page. I also signed the document, and I later added it to the case file.						
Officer Mullins has been working for the San Diego Police Department for 15 years. He currently works in the Canine Unit as a canine handler. He has been a canine handler for over six years.						
Officer Mullins has known Officer who is another canine handler, since he started working at the Canine Unit about four years ago. I asked Officer Mullins to describe his relationship with Officer He told me, "A working relationship."						
Officer Mullins was working on June 6, 2024. He was assigned to 2 nd Watch Canine Patrol. He confirmed hat Thursday's are their "barrel days," where two squads overlap for one day of work. He told me some quads schedule training for those days. He also told me there is more overlap between 2 nd Watch and 3 rd Watch within the Canine Unit than there is with the typical patrol schedules. 2 nd Watch canine officers work from 1300 hours until 0100 hours. 3 rd Watch canine officers work from 2000 hours until 0600 hours.						
Officer Mullins told me he was hanging out at the Canine Training Facility, at 4240 Federal Boulevard, between about 2000 hours and 2100 hours on June 6, 2024. He told me he had an interaction with Officer at about 2030 or 2040 hours that night.						
Officer Mullins said he walked out of the office, onto the landing on the north side of the building. His trainer, Officer was standing on the landing. Officer was out on the field with Officer "taking a bite." Officer Mullins told me the landing goes between the building and the training field. There is a six-foot fence between the landing and the training field. Officer Mullins estimated he was about 20-30 feet away from Officer when their interaction first started. Officer Mullins told me he saw Officer taking the bite on the field, so he turned to Officer and said, "That's what a real trainer looks like." Officer responded to that comment and said, "You better recognize!" Detective Sergeant Chambers asked Officer Mullins about the meaning of his initial comment. Officer Mullins explained that he saw Officer in a bite suit, taking a bite from one of his officers. Officer Mullins told me some trainers will not take bites. Officer is his trainer, so he made the comment to being a "real trainer." He told me it was a "joking comment" to Officer him about Officer He told me they have known one another for over ten years, and they have a "joking relationship." He told me he was "just messing with him." Officer Mullins also acknowledged his comment was complimentary to Officer Officer Mullins told me he "started going back and forth" with Officer Officer Mullins responded to Officer by saying, "Whatever, Officer then started talking about Officer bite from earlier that day. I asked Officer Mullins if he had anything else to add that might assist me with my investigation or my understanding of the incident. He told me, "Yes, sir. First and foremost, I apologize for what I said. What I said was absolutely not meant to be sexual, or anything in that manner. I'm not proud of what I said. I own what I said. I 100% agree that I said it, and I shouldn't have said it. But, I was very upset because my character and the way I conduct myself daily was questioned, and put into question by a trainer of Canine who is held to a higher standard than I am. And he was essentially telling me I'm not using my dog enough. And at the end, he accused me of sending an anonymous letter to IA, which I absolutely didn't do. I have no doubt in my mind, that, you know, I can – I'm mad at myself for saying it. 2. It is not a requirement that the complainant be the intended target of the offensive conduct. Witnessing offensive behavior between other employees may be grounds for complaint.

San Diego Police Department Procedure 5.03 – Equal Employment Opportunity, Subsection VI, D, revised September 2, 2021, states in part:

D. Sexual Harassment

- 1. Sexual harassment is a form of illegal gender discrimination. It is defined by law as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature when:
 - a. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment;
 - b. Submission to, or rejection of, such conduct is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting that employee; or,
 - c. Such conduct has the effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working environment.
- 2. Unwelcome is used in the sense that the offended employee did not solicit or incite the conduct and regarded it as undesirable or offensive.
- 3. The following are examples of sexual harassment. Behavior that constitutes sexual harassment as defined by this policy is not limited to these examples:
 - a. Verbal harassment sexual innuendo, sexually suggestive comments, jokes, teasing of a sexual nature, discussing sexual exploits, spreading rumors of a sexual connotation, or continued requests for social or sexual contact.
 - b. Physical harassment unwelcome contact, touching, or impeding movement.
 - c. Visual harassment sexually suggestive or derogatory posters, videos, cartoons, drawings, documents, writings, electronic mail, texting, staring, or leering.
 - Sexual favors unwanted sexual advances or conditioning an employment benefit on an exchange of sexual favors.

Allegations of conduct contrary to the principles of EEO, or the standards of conduct stated in this Policy, will be taken seriously and investigated in a prompt, thorough, and objective manner.

Whether alleged harassing conduct constitutes sexual harassment is determined on a case-by-case basis by assessing the entire situation and the totality of the circumstances. Factors such as the nature of the conduct and the context in which the alleged conduct occurred will be considered in assessing the allegations and in determining the resolution.

It is the impact of the conduct that is determinative, not whether the conduct was intended to cause harm. For example, a person who teases in a sexual manner or tells sexual jokes may create an offensive work environment for another person even though the comments or actions were intended to be merely "in good fun." This applies to all types of job classifications and work environments. If a person's conduct is harassing to an individual or group of individuals, it does not matter that the person failed to recognize their conduct as unwelcome, offensive, or harassing.

During Officer interview, I asked him if either officer said anything that struck him as being inappropriate or offensive. He said, "That, I do not recall." He told me, "Because I spent 10 years in the military, and I've been on the Department 15 years. I just, I was so frustrated, and so mad, and so angry that I'm being questioned on how I conduct business, when I've never had any problems from my supervisor. At the end of his interview, Officer Mullins said, "First and foremost, I apologize for what I said. What I said was absolutely not meant to be sexual, or anything in that manner. I'm not proud of what I said. I own what I said. I 100% agree that I said it, and I shouldn't have said it." He also told me, "I never meant to say it the way it came out. I didn't mean it that way. And so, I'm sorry."
Though Officer Mullins indicated he did not mean anything sexually by the comment, Officer said it bothered him and made him feel uncomfortable. Officer expressed how the sexual nature of the comment impacted him by telling me it would have been different for Officer Mullins to call him an "errand boy," a "pet," or even a "bitch boy." He said all of those comments would have been different than implying he performed oral sex on his supervisor.
Based on the interviews I conducted, it is clear Officer Mullins made an inappropriate sexual comment to Officer during their interaction outside of the Canine Training Facility on June 6, 2024. Whether he said, "Keep sucking dick" or "The only reason you have what you have is because you suck dick," the comment was sexual in nature and entirely inappropriate for the workplace.
Officer Mullins violated Equal Employment Opportunity regulations when he made this comment to Officer His comment violated Department Procedure 5.03 and the City's Equal Employment Opportunity Policy.

He said, "I was hoping to stop just any sort of, any more confrontation I guess." I asked him, "Did you think, at any point, he was trying to physically get to location?" Officer said, "In my opinion, he was — like I said, he was acting like he was, but I don't think he was really going to jeopardize everything to go fight somebody. But, I mean, he was very angry, and I was having to — I think I was holding him back a little bit." He told me Officer Mullins continued to yell at Officer during that time. He told me Officer was "just making comments towards him." Officer did don't remember what was actually being said at that point. None of the comments stood out to him.

I asked Officer if he ever interpreted any of the behavior as a threat of physical harm or violence. He told me, "Um, I didn't – I mean, it was, like I said, it was hectic. I was having to hold back Mullins. He was very mad, but I mean, it's kinda hard to say if it was like, trying to really run on the field, but he was definitely upset and acting like he wanted to – was going to go down there." Officer told me, "There was concern that he was going to do it, but, like I said, I would hope that nobody would really do that."
During Officer interview, he informed me he did not witness the interaction because he was sitting in his patrol vehicle in the parking lot at that time.
During Officer interview, he told me he did not witness any interaction between Officer Mullins and Officer He told me he walked up afterwards, when Officer Mullins was "getting kinda pushed" by several other officers. He told me he heard some yelling, but he couldn't make out the words. He told me it sounded like a "fight," a "verbal fight," or a "415."
Officer told me he was about 30 yards away when he saw Officer Mullins being pushed. Officer told me he was walking toward the Canine office building from the parking lot. He told me he parked near the "dog break area," which is on the west side of the parking lot. He saw Officer Mullins on the landing on the north side of the building. Officers were pushing, guiding, or escorting him away as if they were breaking up a fight. Officer was not sure how many officers were with Officer Mullins. He estimated there were about three or four of them. He didn't remember who the officers were.
Officer told me he saw Officer Mullins as he walked toward the Canine office. He described Officer Mullins as being "angry and upset about something."
During Officer interview, he told me he was sitting on the bleachers on the landing when the altercation started. He witnessed the interaction. He told me there was initially "some yelling back and forth." He told me he was on his phone at the time, so he wasn't listening to all of it. Officer told me he heard a "big thing at the end that seemed to sort of raise tempers." He said Officer Mullins said something to Officer about "a hidden complaint" or an "anonymous complaint." He told me he didn't know what it was about, but it sounded like Officer Mullins was accusing Officer of writing some kind of "anonymous letters." Officer said Officer responded by saying something back to Officer Mullins. He wasn't sure what was said, but Officer Mullins "got extremely angry at that point." Officer Mullins told Officer "Keep sucking that dick."
Officer told me Officer and Officer Mullins continued yelling back and forth after that. He wasn't sure what was being said. He told me Officer Mullins started to walk closer to the training field. He estimated Officer Mullins and Officer were separated by about 10 feet, but there was a fence and a "drop-off" between them. He said he was told that officers had to use physical force to restrain Officer Mullins. He said he was told that Officer Mullins "batted at" one of the officers with his arm. He told me he didn't personally witness that. Sergeant told me, "When I went outside, my attention was 100% on My eyes were focused on him because he's my employee. And I knew Mullins was there, like, pushing off, like, the left-hand side of me as I walked out the doorway, but I didn't focus on him." During Officer interview, he told me he was in the office when he heard yelling outside. He realized everyone else had left the office, so he decided to go and see what was going on. When Officer walked outside, he became aware that Officer Mullins and Officer were yelling at one another. He told me he couldn't tell who was yelling, or what they were saying, while he was inside the office. When Officer got outside, Officer Mullins was standing on the landing about 15 feet to his left. was out on the field, directly ahead of him and about four feet down from the landing. He was yelling up at Officer Mullins. Officer was out on the field, training with Officer that time. Officer told me Officer Mullins was yelling down at Officer He couldn't remember specifically what was being said or what the interaction was about. He told me he heard "cuss words," but he wasn't sure "who was cussing at who." Officer said, "I could tell both of them were heated at each other." He told me his first thought was, "Grab Mike and pull him away from the situation." He told me he was Officer Mullins' supervisor that night. He told me Sergeant Officer supervisor.

Officer told me Officer Mullins was "peacocking." He compared Officer Mullins to a "drunk" buddy at a bar who's just kind of angry and fluffing." "From your perspective, is that an accurate description of your interaction with those officers?" Officer Mullins said, "I don't recall. But if they're saying that, it could have well happened."
I said, "In your mind, from what you were describing to me, you got to the corner and around, and you never moved back. If they're describing you breaking away and running, at least a distance, toward Officer is that something you think that you just forgot in the moment? Or, like, is it possible that happened?" Officer Mullins said, "I can tell you right now, I never ran anywhere. I never made it anywhere off that landing. I was on that corner the entire time after this inci- like the entire time." I asked, "Is it possible that you moved, say from near where the women's bathroom is to the bleachers, or that distance?" Officer Mullins said, "No. After the comment was made, I was at that corner." I asked, "And you never moved back in his direction at all?" Officer Mullins said, "No. Because he was still out in front of me on the field."
After a short break in the interview, I confirmed that Officer Mullins didn't remember moving back toward Officer at any time. Officer Mullins said, "I don't have recollection of that, sir." I asked Officer Mullins, "Is that something you can say with certainty, you didn't move back in his direction? Or is it something that you may have forgotten due to your state at that time?" Officer Mullins said, "I could have. I don't have any recollection of it, but I definitely – I guess I could have moved back toward him." I asked, "Is it possible, just based on the emotions that you were feeling, that there was some kind of a level of anger or rage that could have blinded you to some of your actions?" Officer Mullins said, "Yes, sir."
I asked Officer Mullins if there was any point during the interaction where he intentionally tried to move toward Officer while he was yelling or upset. He told me, "Not to my recollection." I asked him, "Did you ever intend to get to his location to engage in any kind of a physical altercation with him?" Officer Mullins said, "No, sir. When Officer came to me and told me to go to my car, I went to my car. And that's when Officer was verbally counselling me and telling me I can't do that type of stuff, and I need to act better than that, and I can't say that stuff. Where my car was parked, was right in the front of canine." Interjected, "The question was, did you intend to engage in a physical altercation?" Officer Mullins said, "Absolutely not." I asked Officer Mullins, "Did you ever intend to make him fearful that you may project some kind of a physical danger to him?" Officer Mullins said, "Absolutely not."
Detective Sergeant Chambers asked Officer Mullins if he recalled anyone pulling his vest from behind at any point during this incident. Officer Mullins said, "I don't recall, sarge." Detective Sergeant Chambers asked if he recalled anyone stepping in front of him to create a wall or block him. Officer Mullins said, "I have no recollection of that, to be honest with you."
Officer Mullins' actions were not captured by the surveillance cameras, but there were several witnesses present at the time of the altercation. Based on my interviews, the evidence supports the allegation that Officer Mullins conveyed a physical threat to Officer through his actions.

He compared Officer Mullins to a "drunk buddy at a bar who's just kind of angry and fluffing." When I asked Officer what he believed would have happened if the officers were not there to hold Officer Mullins back, he said, "It was gonna be a fight, 100%." He told me he would have described a suspect behaving that way as exhibiting "assaultive behavior." When asked if he believed his physical safety was jeopardized during this incident, Officer said, "Yes. 100%. 100%." Officer Mullins used the terms "very upset," "so frustrated," "so mad," "so angry," and "infuriated" to describe his feelings during this incident. He said he did not remember anyone physically restraining him, and he did not remember breaking away from other officers or moving back toward Officer any point. Officer Mullins admitted it was possible that his feelings of anger or rage may have blinded him to some of his actions. The evidence in this case indicates Officer Mullins was conveying a threat to Officer actions on June 6, 2024. Though not all witnesses believed Officer Mullins was actually attempting to engage in a physical altercation with Officer the following facts are undisputed: Officer Mullins was described as screaming at the top of his lungs, clenching his fists, and moving toward Officer He was described as pointing at Officer and welling, "Fuck you!" His actions prompted the physical response of multiple officers who were witnessing the interaction. He did not stop when he was first confronted and moved away from the altercation. He physically struggled to pull away from and push past the officers who were restraining him, and he attempted to move back toward Officer Though there was a fence between them, Officer Mullins would have only needed to go down a few steps and walk through a gate to get to Officer location. Based on these facts, Officer Mullins violated the City of San Diego's Threat Management Policy (Administrative Regulation 97.10) when he exhibited threatening and intimidating conduct during an altercation with Officer This allegation is **SUSTAINED**. 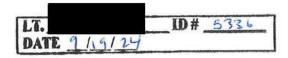

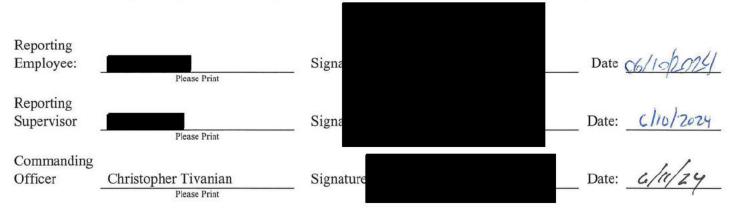
